1884 THEATRE ROYAL HANLEY

The Theatre Royal started life as a Primitive Methodist Chapel in 1841 when it was converted into a theatre by Mr Elphinstone. Originally called the "**People's Hall**" it was later renamed the "**Potteries Royal Theatre**" owned by the "Potteries Theatres Ltd" under the management of Mr Albert Blmer.

The building only survived in this format until 1870 when it was demolished. The first brick of the new theatre was laid in 1870 and within the year "The Theatre Royal" opened in 1871.

In 1875 new developments were funded by licensee Mr Windley who knocked down cottages in Pall Mall to make way for a new entrance and the larger theatre which spilled over into the Brunswick Street area.

The following was at the theatre and included Mr Edward Darbey who later became a theatre owner including the Lyceum Theatre in Crewe for a brief time.

In 1888 the building was enlarged but it was still not large enough for the number of patrons who wanted to visit the theatre and soon well-known theatre designer Frank Matcham was asked to design a new 2,600 seat building.

On the 6 August 1894 the Frank Matcham theatre was opened

Marie Lloyd, Hetty King, George Elliot and Gertie Gitana (Hanley Entertainer) all appeared at the theatre.

An article in the Crewe Chronicle 1 August 1908 announced that Mr Dudley Bennett had taken over the Lyceum theatre in Crewe and had installed Mr Howard as his resident manager. He had previously managed the Royal in Hanley, Hippodrome Eastbourne, and the Eden, Brighton.

Mr John Walshaw managed the theatre Royal Hanley from 1932 to 1938. He had previously managed the Keighley Hippodrome (1918-1932), and theatres in Hull and Chesterfield. He then went on to manage the Theatre in Crewe.

Between the 17 - 22 April 1933 the entertainer George Formby Jnr (Ukulele) appeared at the Theatre Royal Hanley this week. In 1934 he would make his first film "Boots! Boots!"

The week of the 15-20 May 1933 the entertainer Will Fyffe (Comedian) appeared at the Theatre Royal Hanley.

The now legendary Laurel and Hardy appeared at the Theatre Royal Hanley on the 31 March 1952 as part of their one and only UK Tour.

In 1934 a small fire caused damage to the Matcham theatre but on the 2 June 1949 at 5am a fire ripped through the building destroying it completely.

On the 14 August 1951 a new building was opened with Amile Littler's production of "Annie Get your Gun" starring Annette MacDonald, but after poor attendance it was sold 10 years later to MECCA Bingo halls.

27 Oct 1958 Tony Hancock appeared at the Theatre Royal, Hanley for the week.

In 1980 it closed as a Bingo hall. 18 months later in August 1982 it was opened by local Theatre enthusiasts under the company name "Theatre Royal Restoration Trust".

On the 7 September 1982 it again closed. On the same day, 7 September in 1984 the theatre was opened by a new company called "Theatre Royal Hanley PLC".

The 10 March 1983 Crewe Chronicle announced that the Lyceum Crewe Administrator Mr Leslie Parker -Davies has been appointed to the same post at the "Theatre Royal". He will work with the Theatre Royal trustees under the Chairmanship of Mr Charles Deacon.

9 March 1987 and the KEN DODD "Palace of Laughter" was a recorded at the theatre produced by BBC Radio 2 by Ron Mc Donnal. The programmes were broadcast in September 1987.

In 1988 Carl Reiner the famous American film producer made a film in Stoke on Trent called "Bert Rigby You're a Fool" starring Robert Lindsay in the title role. The film was based on the story of a young dancer who wants to find fame and restore his old theatre into a variety theatre. The Theatre Royal doubled as the exterior of the building and filming took place over two days (2 June and ## 1988). The film was also directed by Carl Reiner and assisted by Marty Ewing.

The comedian Ben Warriss of Jewell and Warris fame was still performing in the 1990's with one of his last appearances at the Theatre Royal in Hanley in Pantomime during his appearance at the theatre he became ill. He died on the 14 January 1993 (.b. 29 May 1909) in poverty, while his entertainment partner Jimmy Jewell on the other hand died peacefully in 1995.

During the 1990's it went through various Managers before closing on the 23 April 1996.

It was taken over by Mike Lloyd in November 1996 who after redeveloping the building, managed to get Ken Dodd to open it on the 29 November 1997. Mr Lloyd ran the theatre as a "Theatre and live music venue". It then became a Night club "Jumping Jacks" in 2000. (1438 Seats)

In June 1998 the theatre Royal in Hanley celebrated its history with a show on stage called "THE ROYAL STORY". Artists including Gertie Gitana (Virginia Bryan playing the part) a local singer from the Potteries who made the song "Nellie Dean" a hit, Gracie Fields (Also Virginia Bryan), Max Miller (Ray Johnson), Laurel and Hardy (Pete Lindup and Steve King), Frank Randle (Roy Watts), Norman Evans (Roy Watts), George Formby (John Walley) and Flannigan and Allen (Ray Johnson and Richard Masters) will be appearing in this tribute show directed by Ray Johnson. The show started at 9pm on Friday Night the 13 June 1998 and also included film and live performances (by copycat artists) from artists who have appeared at the theatre.

An 1870 report said 'A new theatre is to be erected at Hanley during the coming summer. It will occupy the same site as the present building, which is a very inconvenient and inelegant structure, and will be more than twice as large. It will be 113ft. long, by 54ft. wide, with two tiers of boxes, gallery, and pit, seating 3200 persons.

The stage will have a depth of 42ft., and a width of 54ft. and will be provided with an iron drop-curtain, as a precaution in case of fire. The dressing-rooms and green-room, will be on a level with the stage. Attached to the boxes and pit will be retiring-rooms.

The street front will be in the Corinthian style, the materials used being of red, black, and yellow bricks, with terra-cotta pillars, caps, pediment, and panels bearing medallion portraits of Massinger, Shakespeare, and Ben Jonson, and monograms of the proprietors.

The scenery will move vertically, instead of horizontally, and spacious cellars will be left below the stage. The estimated cost of the new erection will be £4500, and the plans have been prepared by one of the proprietors, who is said to have given much study to the subject.'

Architects C.J. Phipps and Frank Matcham were given the job of rebuilding the theatre.

On the 8 August 1887 the new theatre was opened.

The first production was CRIMES OF PARIS.

The theatre holds 1,100 people (250 in the Circle / 250 in the Upper Circle / Gallery 1,000) and has a refreshment-bar, ladies cloak-room. There are also 12 Dressing Rooms. The stage is 92ft wide and 46ft deep (Laid in 20 sections), with a back drop painted by Mr Edmund A Swift of the Manchester and Sheffield Theatres who was hired as a permanent scenic painter at the theatre.

The main entrance is from Pall Mall while the gallery is entered from Brunswick Street. Another report puts the seating at a capacity of 3,700 when it opened.

NEW THEATRE MANAGER

Sometime during 1929 the theatre hired Archie Thompson as the new manager of the Theatre Royal Hanley. He had been an actor manager before coming to Hanley and was married to actress Belle Russell.

Archie was also a friend of George Bernard Shaw.

In 1938, Archie retired as manager due to ill health caused by the effects of the First World War and he and his wife Bell started to take in theatricals at their home in Hanley.

In 1982, Belle died at the age of 95.

Their daughter, Miss Winifred Thompson was the deputy head of Sneyd Green Primary School.

The stage newspaper of the 9 June 1949, reported on the fire.

'Fire, destroying the Royal, Hanley, in a three-hour blaze, on Thursday last, has deprived a community of 330,000 of its last professional theatre. Fred Peake, local bus service pioneer, who bought the Royal from a Potteries syndicate four years ago for £72,000, has assured our correspondent that he will "rebuild it, and be putting on shows at the earliest possible moment."

Stoke-on-Trent City aldermen and councillors have said that, recognising what it means for such a large community to be without a single "live" theatre, they will give any priority possible under current building restrictions to speed up rebuilding. With the theatre gutted, roof gone, stage and backstage destroyed and only the fover and offices intact, an architect's estimate of the cost of rebuilding is. "Anything up to £150.000." Of this, it is stated, only £30,000 is covered by insurance... Neal. ...The fire, the cause of which is unknown, was discovered by a passing policeman at 5 a.m. By 8 a.m. the fire was out, but the theatre was a hollow shell. Sadler's Wells Theatre Ballet lost almost everything they had on tour, including unique music scores and many orchestral instruments. Dancers wept in the street outside the theatre, and 18-year-old Australian principal ballerina, Elaine Fifield, in great distress, said, "Nearly everything I had in England has gone. I almost wish I had been burnt with it." With everything for the tour-repertory gone, and an engagement at Hull duly fulfilled on Monday, Peggy van Praagh, the ballet-mistress, phoned Covent Garden to find what settings were in stock, and had the company rehearsing ballets to suit in a Methodist Sunday school nearby the same afternoon. Harry Hanson's Court Players were to have started a season of repertory on Monday. Percy E. Hughes, general manager of the theatre, made tremendous efforts to find an alternative hall so that the Court Players' engagements could be kept, but his quest failed as the theatre is the only one in the Potteries area, the Potteries motor transport company is endeavouring to make arrangements to cater for the entertainment needs of North Staffordshire theatre-goers by running special excursion trips to Birmingham, Wolverhampton, Manchester, Liverpool and Dudley. Fire has struck heavily at the stage in the Potteries. Up to 1932 the district had two top-rate halls, but in that year the Grand, 100 yards away from the Royal, and built by the proprietors of the old Royal, was destroyed by fire in similar circumstances. In 1894, what was then the finest theatre building in the Potteries – The Queen's, Longton - was destroyed by fire. It is curious that the man who is credited with establishing the local pre-eminence of the Royal in the 1870's, James Elphin-stone, took it over after he had lost a fortune through the London Pavilion, of which he was lessee, being burned down. Thieves had absconded with his safe on the night of the fire.'

Theatre Royal owner Don Stewart didn't expect to be chaining shut the doors 18 months later and £105,000 worse off.

Don Stewart and fellow directors Sarah Shaw and Colin Fisher took over in 1994. A few months after taking over the pantomime "Aladdin" with Jack Wild in the cast was cancelled followed by a sell out "Rita, Sue and Bob Too". In 1995 the Blues Brothers raked in £50,000 with its return in 1996 making £70,000 but with the revamped Regent Theatre and a plea to the Council for £140,000 towards refurbishment being turned down on the morning of the 23 Apr 1996 the theatre was in a bad way.

After four years of running the Royal the doors finally closed on the building which would never see the theatrical lights again as it lay dark for many years before being turned into a night club.
